Ann is a member of the Kansas State Board of Education representing District 4 which includes only Shawnee Heights in Shawnee County along with Osage, Douglas, Franklin, Johnson and Leavenworth county school districts. Ann said that literacy is one of their big pushes and that the State has given \$15 million toward the LETRS (Language Essentials for Teachers of Reading and Spelling) program which is designed to teach teachers how to teach reading. This is being used in USD 450 with success. It is said that students learn to read through the third grade then read to learn after the third grade. Ann also mentioned an increased push for a financial literacy requirement, possible teacher shortage solutions, mental health pilot programs where students could receive care in school so parents do not have to take them to appointments, technical education in the high schools, Native American history education, nine free college hours earned in high school, and the Promise Scholarship among Diana made homemade apple other things. dumplings topped with ice cream for dessert.
