Program Chair Denise invited Shane Hilton to be our speaker for the November meeting. Shane grew up in the Shawnee Heights area and in addition to being the clerk on the Tecumseh Township board, he is also the chief of police for the Shawnee Heights School District. After retiring from the Topeka Police Department, Shane was hired at USD 450 as their only school resource officer. Currently the force has grown to 3 officers in addition to one deputy provided by the Shawnee County Sheriff. Unfortunately school resource officers have become a fixture on school campuses due to the increase of school shootings. Originally SRO's were used to create a bond between students and the police and that it still a very useful purpose today.

At Shawnee Heights there are over 500 cameras throughout the various buildings and the city has the ability to view those cameras to direct outside resources to the proper areas in case it is ever needed. All schools have buzzer systems at entrances to screen who may enter the buildings. The SRO's receive training from the Sheriff's Department in addition to meeting with SRO's from other area school districts. Students have applications on their tablets or laptops that allow them to anonymously report any questionable behavior.

The SRO's job is not to handle the normal school punishment, which is left to administration, but rather to deal with more serious situations where the law is being broken. We are grateful to have officers like Shane interacting with and protecting our students.
